New Canine Health Fund Information On Prevalence of Diseases

In October 2003, the American Kennel Club Canine Health Foundation released a publication entitled "Canine Breed-Specific Risks Of Frequently Diagnosed Diseases At Veterinary Teaching Hospitals," by Dr. Richard Dorn, the Foundation's Science Officer and a Professor Emeritus of the Ohio State College of Veterinary Medicine. The source

of the breed-specific diagnoses was the Veterinary Medical database (VMDB) maintained at Purdue University. The VMDB began collecting records of all animal diagnoses from two veterinary colleges in April 1965. It was rapidly expanded to include 14 colleges by 1970 and it included 24 colleges in 1995

at the time of the data search. It thus represents a much larger database than can be achieved in a dog club health survev. In addition, the diagnoses - made by veterinarians who are among the most skilled diagnosticians available - are likely to be much more accurate than diagnoses reported by dog owners, some of whom may be basing their reports on diagnoses they made themselves. Even so, the data probably does not represent the actual statistical incidence of the various disorders in the general population of dog breeds because the patient population served by teaching and research institutional hospitals includes many referrals of more difficult cases from private practitioners. The database thus likely includes a higher proportion of serious and difficult to manage disorders than would the caseload of a general veterinary practice. On the other hand, the more serious and difficult-to-manage disorders are the ones that should be of greatest concern to breeders.

The information in the VMDB database on prevalence of disorders in Miniature Schnauzers is not new to breeders of Miniature Schnauzers. It has been provided to the AMSC as a benefit of the AMSC's membership in CERF. What is new is an "Odds Ratio" Dr. Dorn has compiled for each of the top 10 diseases within each of 78 breeds of dogs. A specific disease Odds Ratio of 4 in

a breed means the risk of that disorder is 4 times greater in that breed as compared to the risk in the 78 breeds combined. Conversely, an Odds Ratio of 0.25 means that the breed has only one-fourth the risk for the disorder as compared the risk in the 78 breeds combined.

Pancreatitis, the 8th most prevalent disorder in Miniature Schnauzers, proved to be an astounding 55 times more prevalent in Miniature Schnauzers than in the average of the 78 breeds combined. Diabetes, the 6th most prevalent disorder in Miniature Schnauzers, was 10 times more prevalent in Miniature Schnauzers than in the average of the 78 breeds. By comparison, dental calculus, the most prevalent disorder in Miniature Schnauzers, was only 1.22 times as prevalent in Miniature Schnauzers as in the average of the 78 breeds, and cataracts, the second most prevalent disorder in Miniature Schnauzers, was only a little more than half as prevalent in Miniature Schnauzers as in the 78 breeds. Urinary calculus, the third most prevalent disorder in Miniature Schnau-

NEW INFORMATION ON PREVALENCE of Diseases....continued from page 1

zers was about 7.8 times as prevalent in Miniature Schnauzers as in the 78 breeds.

The "Odds Ratio" information is fascinating, but it does not give breeders any new tools with which to try to eliminate health problems in the breed. It should, however, serve as a reminder to American Miniature Schnauzer breeders that they have devoted much less attention to endocrine disorders such as pancreatitis, diabetes, and adrenal cortical hyperfunction (Cushings' disease) that are prevalent in the breed than they have to other disorders such as PRA, cataracts, and urinary calculi. The reason is probably that the endocrine disorders tend to be disorders of middle age that occur after a dog's show career is over and after many animals have been placed in new homes by breeders. (Out of sight, out of mind!) Nonetheless, they are diseases that occur well before the end of the animal's expected lifetime, that significantly affect the quality of an animal's life, and that are often difficult, time-consuming, and expensive for dog owners to manage. As a result, many affected animals are euthanized prematurely because their owners are unwilling or unable to devote the time and money necessary to manage the diseases.

Breeders need to be (a) more aware of disorders that occur in animals of post-showing and breeding age and (b) more conscientious about staying in touch with their puppy buyers and with persons with whom they have placed adult animals in order to follow up on health problems that may occur to those animals as they age. We cannot deal with health problems we do not even know are occurring in our lines.

With information on incidence of disease in middle-aged animals they have bred, breeders who find that particular disorders are recurring in their lines can try to breed away from those disorders by avoiding linebreeding or inbreeding. (Breeding away from disorders where the prevalence in Miniature Schnauzers is substantially higher than in other breeds such as pancreatitis and diabetes - *may* prove to be relatively easy because the large disparity in occurrence relative to other breeds may indicate that the height-

ened susceptibility of Miniature Schnauzers to the disorder is due to an unusual gene combination that can be eliminated by careful breeding.)

On the other hand, outcrossing brings the risk of importing new disorders into a breeder's lines: and information about incidence of disease in other lines is not as easilv available as information about the incidence in one's own lines. The most practical, though imperfect, solution is to ask about recurring disorders in the line when considering breeding to a stud dog or buying an animal from outside one's own lines. You may not get an honest answer, but the odds of getting information are unquestionably better when you ask for it than when you do not ask for it. Some AMSC members have suggested health registries as a solution to the information deficit. The sad truth, however, is that someone who is not willing to give you a straight answer when you ask is even less likely to voluntarily make the information publicly available to a registry.

Finally, since pancreatitis attacks (and possibly symptoms of other endocrine disorders as well) can be triggered or aggravated by high fat diets and obesity, Miniature Schnauzer breeders should discuss appropriate diet and weight management with buyers of puppies and adult dogs.


