Prior to 1933

The following information was excerpted from "The Miniature Schnauzer" by Anne FitzGerald. Published in 1935 and from other sources. This book was authorized and underwritten by The American Miniature Schnauzer Club.

The Wire-Haired Pincher Club of America was formed in 1925. About 1926 the name of the breed was officially changed to "Schnauzer". Both Standard and Miniature Schnauzers were represented by the Schnauzer Club of America. Miniatures were officially recognized by the American Kennel Club (AKC) in the fall of 1926, when they were first granted registration. Separate classes were first provided in February 1927 at The Combined Terrier Clubs Speciality Show. Up to 1931 there were awards for Best Standard Schnauzer and Best Miniature Schnauzer, with representatives of each breed competing in the Group. Then the AKC changed its rule and allowed only one "Best" until the spring of 1933, when separate awards were again provided. This was followed by a change in the Stud Book, which after seven years suddenly declared that a speciality club was supposed to cover but one breed, and therefore all were Schnauzers without distinction. The only remedy was to dissolve the old Schnauzer Club of America and form two new organizations, the Standard Schnauzer Club of America and The American Miniature Schnauzer Club.

The Schnauzer Club of America participated in the Combined Terrier Clubs Speciality Show in 1927. This was considered the first speciality show of the Schnauzer Club of America. The BOB Miniature Schnauzer at this show was Sieger and later American Ch. Don v. Dombusch. The next speciality show, held at Oyster Bay occurred in 1931; BOB was Ch. Billy v. d. Zonnenheuvel. In 1932 there was no BOB (breeds were combined) but BW was Ch. Patricia. In 1933, with the breeds again separated, BOB at Morris and Essex was Ch. Mehitabel of Marienhof III. On August 19, 1933 the American Schnauzer Club was formed and the first speciality of the AMSC was held shortly thereafter in conjunction with the Western Speciality Club in Chicago. This show is considered the first speciality show of the AMSC.

Prior to 1933, Continued

A copy of an early, handwritten ledger showing current and/or resigned members was provided for inclusion in this history. Some names were very difficult to decipher and, therefore, spelling may be incorrect in those instances. It is anticipated that the list is not totally complete. Membership names which were designated as Standard Schnauzer members only are not listed. However, many names had no designation and may have been Standard Schnauzer Club members only but not listed as such. The listing is provided over the next several years as it applies.

MINIATURE SCHNAUZER STANDARD, 1934

The Miniature Schnauzer is a robust, active dog of terrier type, resembling his larger cousin, the Medium Schnauzer, in general appearance, and of an alert, active disposition. He should be sturdily built, nearly square in proportion of body length to height, with plenty of bone, less racy in outline than a Fox Terrier, and without any suggestion of toyishness.

The Head should be strong and rectangular, diminishing slightly from ear to eyes, and again to the tip of the nose. The skull should be fairly broad between the ears, its width not exceeding two thirds of its length, the forehead flat and unwrinkled, the nose straight and almost parallel to the extension of the forehead (i.e. neither dish-faced nor down-faced) with a moderate stop. The muzzle should be strong, in proportion to the skull, and should end in a moderately blunt manner, with wiry whiskers, accentuating the rectangular shape of the head. The tip of the nose should be black, the lips tight and not overlapping, with well developed fangs, healthy and pure white. The jaw should meet in a scissors bite, the upper front teeth passing just outside the lower, with no space between. The eyes should be medium sized, dark brown, oval, turned forward, with the brow arched and wiry. Ears should be evenly shaped, set high and carried erect when cropped. If uncropped they should be small and V shaped, of moderate thickness, folding close to the skull. Too long and narrow a skull, soft, silky whiskers and top knot, light yellow, large or protruding eyes, low set houndy ears, under and overshot mouths are faults.

The neck should be strong and slightly arched, set cleanly on the shoulders, and with the skin fitting closely at the throat. Too short and thick, long and light, or too throaty a neck is undesirable.

The Forequarters should have flat, strongly muscled, *somewhat sloping* shoulders, without the steep-set "terrier front." The forelegs should be straight and vertical when seen from all sides. The chest should be moderately broad, reaching at least to the elbows, and extending well back. The back should be strong and straight, with well developed withers. The length should equal the height at the withers. The belly should be well drawn up toward the flank, but should not give a tucked up appearance. Too narrow or too broad chest, loose shoulders of elbows, weak back, and shallow body are faults.

The Hindquarters should have strongly muscled, slanting thighs, and should never appear overbuilt or higher than the shoulders. When standing naturally, the line from the hip to the knee should be vertical, from knee to hock should be parallel to the upper neck line, and from the hock to the ground should be vertical.

The Tail should be set moderately high and carried erect. It is cut down to three joints and should not be longer than one inch.

The Feet should be short and round, with the toes well arched (cat's paws), dark nails and dark pads.

The Coat should be hard and wiry, neither smooth nor long, but giving a slightly rough appearance when seen against the grain. The outer coat should be harsh to the touch, the undercoat close and soft. It should be trimmed only enough to accentuate the body outline, and should be not less than three quarters of an inch long, except on the ears and skull.

The Size should be from 10½ to 13½ inches for males and 10 to 12½ inches for females. Animals *under* or over these heights should be faulted, but no animal should be disqualified for oversize unless more than 14 inches if a male or 13 inches if a female. The ideal size approximates 12 inches, the males running slightly larger. Too small, toyish appearing dogs are not typical and should be penalized.

The Color should be pepper and salt or similar equal mixtures, light or dark, and including "red pepper," pure black, and black and tan. Faults are solid colors other than black, also very light, whitish, spotted or tiger colors, but a small white spot on the breast is not a fault.

Faults are as above enumerated, and also dogs too low or high legged; too heavy in head; with badly cut or carried ears; too steep or too level croup; straight shoulders; low shoulders; cow-hocks; toed-in, long or spreading feet; weak pasterns; light bone; coat too long and soft or curly, and too short and smooth, or too closely trimmed; shy, savage, or highly nervous temperament.

Disqualifications: Dogs over 14 inches and bitches over 13 inches; albinos; dogs entered in contravention of state laws forbidding the exhibition of cropped dogs.

Critique by Judge Joseph C. Quirk:

I have been asked to give a report, from the judge's standpoint, of the Miniature Schnauzer Speciality Show held in conjunction with the Terrier Show at Montgomery County Kennel Club on Sunday, October 1, 1939. Unfortunately, any remarks I express here are given from memory after a lapse of a week, as I made absolutely no notes during the judging.

I have been asked to criticize the various entries and also to express my opinion on what I liked about the various entries; to, what, in my opinion, were the weak spots creeping into the breed; and to offer any suggestions for improving same.

I was tremendously impressed with the marked improvement in the breed since I last judged it, particularly in type and soundness. You have achieved what very few breeders achieve in such a short time, namely similarity of type throughout. A layman could tell, even in the large classes, that they were all Miniature Schnauzers.

Almost universally the mouths are excellent and I see no danger ahead from this normally common fault. The color of the eyes as a whole was beautiful.

The bitches were a more uniform lot than the dogs. It was a very beautiful sight when the class winning bitches came into the ring to see them all the same type and almost, except for the puppy, the same size.

I found the fronts on the whole very good. As a matter of fact, the fronts were better than the hindquarters. I would like to put one word of caution in here about future breeding. You should pay very strict attention to hindquarter angulation. The dog need some angulation or he could not move as a real Schnauzer should move. The Miniature Schnauzer is, as the name implies. A miniature replica of the Standard Schnauzer, and as the Standard Schnauzer is a working terrier he must have some rear angulation and power in his drive to enable him to do the work for which he was created. So many breeds have come to grief through breeding for beauty, and this should be avoided in the Schnauzer. Hindquarter angulation, soundness and true gait should be watched very carefully.

My greatest criticism on the whole would be the inclination to straight hindquarters and in some cases, excessive length of back. On this latter subject, very definite penalty should be imposed on bodies too long. They are not desirable according to the Standard and will bring you a great deal of grief in weak backs in years to come if they are permitted. This is the time to stamp out bodies and backs too long.

1939 Continued:

Critique by Judge Joseph C. Quirk, Continued:

There were a few dogs weak in foreface, but not many. You should guard against too long a head or anything approaching a likeness to a Wire Haired Fox Terrier head, as it is not characteristic of the breed.

I must be of extreme gratification to the breeders to feel that they have made tremendous progress in the improvement of the breed as a whole. When I look back ten and fifteen years ago, where a really good type of Miniature Schnauzer was rare, and look at what comes into the ring today, some of you people who have been responsible for this change must be congratulated. You certainly have standardized the Miniature Schnauzer, and dogs taking third and fourth in a class at the Speciality Show could have, a few years ago, been Best of Breed without any question. You breeders again deserve congratulations because your American Bred dogs, in my opinion, are equally as good as the foreign dogs. As a matter of fact, the Best of Breed was an American-Bred dog. Even if the war now raging in Europe continues for an indefinite period, the Miniature Schnauzer should not suffer because you apparently have the proper blood lines in this country and can continue to breed what you have without the importation of new blood.

In closing the general comments, let me caution against short necks. There were not many, but there were a few exhibited. This should be watched because it takes away from the style and the true conformation of the dog. Avoid short, chunky necks and avoid profuse whiskers. A dog with very heavy whiskers is getting into a soft coat, as it is impossible to grow profuse whiskers with a real true, harsh coat. Speaking of coats, they seem to be universally harsh and of good texture.

At this point, I would like to congratulate Mrs. Slattery of Marienhof Kennels, because in **Ch. T.M.G. of Marienhof** (Ch. Marko of Marienhof - Tyranena Pansy of Marienhof) she apparently has a sire who is definitely stamping the breed with his quality. His get were definitely outstanding in type and soundness throughout the show and he very easily won the Stud Dog Class.

In the American-Bred Dog Class I was particularly impressed with the first and second dogs, namely **(Ch.) Normack Fiedler** (Ch. Fleiger of Edgeover - Miss Flash of Bramall) and **(Ch.) Bubs of Burnfort** (a brother to T.M.G.), but particularly the first dog. I think when he is a year older he will be a very difficult dog to beat. They were both of a very good size, and the decision went to **Fiedler** because he moved a litter better on the day. The dogs were very much of a type and it was not an easy decision.

In the Open Dog Class, the dog I placed here namely **(Ch.) Wingless Victor of Sharvogue** (Ch. T.M.G. of Marienhof - Wild Honey of Sharvogue), was most impressive. He was a splendid size and type, not too large or too coarse, with a very good head, splendid coat, sound moving with grand depth of body and a good short back. I placed him over the second dog, **(Ch.) Kubla Kahn of Marienhof** (Ch. T.M.G. of Marienhof - Ch. Kathleen of Marienhof), because I preferred his size and type, although the second dog is a very sound dog in all respects. However, I felt that to follow throughout the show with the type that in my opinion is the proper type, **Wingless Victor** had to be given first in this class. He went to Winners Dog and Best of Winners, and reserve to him was **Fiedler**, also of the same size and type as the Winners Dog.

In the Novice Bitch class of three, the first went to Dr. Briggs' **Grey Mist of Sharvogue** (a sister to Wingless Victor) a beautiful type of splendid proportions and size, who later went to Reserve Winners Bitch, and in my opinion can later possibly beat her sister, the Winners Bitch.

In the Limit Class, there were four bitches, the first going to Dr. Briggs' **(Ch.) Short Wave of Sharvogue** (another sister to Wingless Victor), and the Open Class was won by still another litter sister, this time owned by Mrs. Briggs, called **(Ch.) Symphony of Sharvogue**. She went on to Winners Bitch.

The remarkable part of this whole thing is that the four of the major class winners, including the Winners Dog and Bitch, are all from the same litter. I don't believe I have ever encountered this in all my judging experience. They were so much the desired type and so very sound that I had no alternative but to put them up.

This is one of the reasons I spoke of the congratulations due to Mrs. Slattery for producing a dog that could sire any one litter of such type. At this time congratulations are also due to Dr. and Mrs. Briggs as the breeders of such a remarkable litter.

1939 Continued:

Critique by Judge Joseph C. Quirk, Continued:

It was a great pleasure, in addition to a beautiful sight, to see and judge the Best of Breed Class. There were nine in the ring at this time and it was no easy matter to select a winner. Best of Breed finally was awarded to **Ch. Minquas Marko** (Ch. T.M.G. of Marienhof - Susan of Marienhof) owned by Norcrest Kennels. This dog, to me, has type, soundness, and is a good size. We had such dogs in the ring as **Ch. Qualm Heinzelmännchen**, **Ch. Brookmeade Zuzu**, **Ch. Dorem Dubonnet**, **Ch. Mitze of Roxbury**, **Ch. Welf Anfiger** and **Ch. Twiddles of Marienhof**.

One last caution - do not get your Miniature Schnauzers too large. Keep them well within the limit. After all they are a Miniature Schnauzer!

MINIATURE SCHNAUZER STANDARD 1941

The Miniature Schnauzer is a robust, active dog of the terrier type, resembling his larger cousin, the Standard Schnauzer in general appearance, and of an alert, active disposition. He should be sturdily built, nearly square in proportion of body length to height, with plenty of bone, less racy in outline than a Fox Terrier, and without any suggestion of toyishness.

The head should be strong and rectangular, diminishing slightly from the ear to eyes, and again to the tip of the nose. The skull should be fairly broad between the ears, its width not exceeding two thirds of its length, the forehead flat and unwrinkled, the nose straight and almost parallel to the extension of the forehead (i.e. neither dish-faced nor down faced) with a moderate stop. The muzzle should be strong, in proportion to the skull, should end in a moderately blunt manner, with wiry whiskers, accentuating the rectangular shape of the head. The tip of the nose should be black, the lips tight and not overlapping, with well developed fangs, healthy and pure white. The jaw should meet in a scissors bite, the upper teeth passing just outside the lower, with no space between. The eyes should be medium sized, dark brown, oval, turned forward, with the brow arched and wiry. Ears should be evenly shaped, set high and carried erect when cropped. If uncropped, they should be small and V shaped, of moderate thickness, folding forward close to the skull. Too long and narrow a skull, soft, silky whiskers and top knot, light yellow, large or protruding eyes, low set, houndy ears, under or overshot mouths are faults.

The neck should be strong and slightly arched, set cleanly on the shoulders, and with the skin fitting closely at the throat. Too short and thick, long and light, or too throaty a neck is undesirable.

The Forequarters should have flat, strongly muscled, *somewhat sloping* shoulders, without the steep-set "terrier front." The forelegs are straight and vertical when seen from all sides. The chest should be moderately broad, reaching at least to the elbows, and extending well back. The back should be strong and straight, with well developed withers. The length should equal the height at the withers. The belly should be well drawn up toward the flank, but should not give a tucked up appearance. Too narrow or too broad chest, loose shoulders or elbows, weak back, and shallow body are faults.

The Hindquarters should have strongly muscled, slanting thighs, and should never appear overbuilt or higher than the shoulders. When standing naturally, the line from hip to knee should be vertical, from knee to hock should be parallel to the upper neck line, and from the hock to the ground should be vertical.

The Tail should be set moderately high and carried erect. It is cut down to three joints and should not be longer than one inch.

The Feet should be short and round, with the toes well arched (cat's paws), with dark nails and hard pads.

The Coat should be hard and wiry, neither smooth nor long, but giving a slightly rough appearance when seen against the grain. The outer coat should be harsh to the touch, the undercoat close and soft. It should be trimmed only enough to accentuate the body outline, and should be not less than three quarters of an inch long, except on the ears and skull.

1941 Continued:

MINIATURE SCHNAUZER STANDARD 1941 (Continued)

The Size should be from 11½ to 13½ inches for males and females. Animals *under* or over these heights should be faulted, but no animal should be disqualified for oversize unless more than 14 inches. The ideal size approximate 13 inches, the males running slightly larger. Too small, toyish appearing dogs are not typical and should be penalized.

The Color should be pepper and salt or similar equal mixtures, light or dark, and including the "red pepper," pure black, and black and tan. Faults are solid colors other than black, also very light, whitish, spotted or tiger colors, but a small white spot on the breast is not a fault.

Faults, are as above enumerated, and also dogs too low or high legged; too heavy in head; with badly cut or carried ears; too steep or too level croup; straight shoulders; low shoulders; cow-hocks; toed-in, long or spreading feet; weak pasterns; light bone; coat too long and soft or curly, and too short and smooth, or too closely trimmed; shy, savage, or highly nervous temperament.

Disqualifications: Dogs or bitches over 14 inches; albinos; dogs entered in contravention of state laws forbidding the exhibition of cropped dogs.

THE BREED STANDARD OF THE MINIATURE SCHNAUZER (approved May 13, 1958)

General Appearance - The Miniature Schnauzer is a robust, active dog of terrier type, resembling his larger cousin, the Standard Schnauzer, in general appearance, and of an alert, active disposition. He is sturdily built, nearly square in proportion of body length to height, with plenty of bone, and without any suggestion of Toyishness.

Head - Strong and rectangular, its width diminishing slightly from ears to eyes, and again to the tip of the nose. The forehead is unwrinkled. The top skull is flat and fairly long. The foreface is parallel to the top skull, with a slight stop, and is at least as long as the top skull. The muzzle is strong in proportion to the skull; it ends in a moderately blunt manner, with thick whiskers which accentuate the rectangular shape of the head. *Teeth* - The teeth meet in a scissors bite. That is, the upper teeth overlap the lower front teeth in such a manner that the inner surface of the upper incisors barely touches the outer surface of the lower incisors when the mouth is closed. *Eyes* - Small, dark brown and deep-set. They are oval in appearance and keen in expression. *Ears* - When cropped the ears are identical in shape and length, with pointed tips. They are in balance with the head and not exaggerated in length. They are set high on the skull and carried perpendicularly at the inner edges, with as little bell as possible along the outer edges. When uncropped, the ears are small and V-shaped, folding close to the skull.

Neck - Strong and well arched, blending into the shoulders, and with the skin fitting tightly at the throat.

Body - Short and deep, with the brisket extending at least to the elbows. Ribs are well sprung and deep, extending well back to a short loin. The underbody does not present a tucked-up appearance at the flank. The topline is straight; it declines slightly from the withers to the base of the tail. The overall length from chest to stern bone equals the height at the withers.

Forequarters - The forequarters have flat, somewhat sloping shoulders and high withers. Forelegs are straight and parallel when viewed from all sides. They have strong pasterns and good bone. They are separated by a fairly deep brisket which precludes a pinched front. The elbows are close, and the ribs spread gradually from the first rib so as to allow space for the elbows to move close to the body.

Hindquarters - The hindquarters have strong-muscled, slanting thighs: they are well bent at the stifles and straight from hock to so-called heel. There is sufficient angulation so that, in stance, the hocks extend beyond the tail. The hindquarters never appear overbuilt or higher than the shoulders.

Feet - Short and round (cat-feet) with thick, black pads. The toes are arched and compact.

Action - The trot is the gait at which movement is judged. The dog must gait in a straight line. Coming on, the forelegs are parallel with the elbows close to the body. The feet turn neither inward nor outward. Going away, the hind legs are parallel from the hocks down and travel wide. Viewed from the side, the forelegs have a good reach, while the hind legs have a strong drive with good pickup of hocks.

Tail - Set high and carried erect. It is docked only long enough to be clearly visible over the topline of the body when the dog is in proper length of coat.

1958 Continued:

THE BREED STANDARD OF THE MINIATURE SCHNAUZER (Continued) (approved May 13, 1958)

Coat- Double, with a hard, wiry outer coat and a close undercoat. The body coat should be plucked. When in show condition, the proper length is not less than three-quarters of an inch except on the neck, ears, and skull. Furnishings are fairly thick but not silky.

Size- From 12 to 14 inches. Ideal size 13½ inches. (See *disqualifications*.)

Color - The recognized colors are salt and pepper, black and silver, and solid black. The typical color is salt and pepper in shades of gray; tan shading is permissible. The salt and pepper mixture fades out to light gray or silver white in the eyebrows, whiskers, cheeks, under throat, across chest, under tail, leg furnishings under body, and inside legs. The light underbody hair is not to rise higher on the sides of the body than the front elbows.

The black and silvers follow the same pattern as the salt and peppers. The entire salt-and-pepper section must be black.

Black is the only solid color allowed. It must be a true black with no gray hairs and no brown tinge except where the whiskers may have become discolored. A small white spot on the chest is permitted.

Faults

Type- Toyishness, raciness, or coarseness. *Structure*- Head coarse and cheeky. Chest too broad or shallow in brisket. Tail set low. Sway or roach back. Bowed or cowhocked hindquarters. Loose elbows.

Action - Sidegaiting. Paddling in front, or high hackney knee action. Weak hind action. *Coat*- Too soft or too smooth and slick in appearance. *Temperament*- Shyness or viciousness. *Bite*- Undershot or overshot jaw. Level bite. *Eyes* - Light and / or large and prominent in appearance.

Disqualifications

Dogs or bitches under 12 inches or over 14 inches. Color solid white or white patches on the body.

Critique by Fall Speciality Sweepstakes Judge Mrs. Robert J. Huber:

A ten-minute drive from our own home brought us to the beautiful estate of G. Harrison Frazier, Jr., in Gwynedd Valley. As usual, the grounds were as well groomed as the meticulously groomed terriers who paraded throughout the day. The bright red-orange blooms and green, green foliage of the pyracantha provided a dramatic backdrop for the rings. Mr. Frazier was a wonderful host, not only by making available his estate, but by extending a warm welcome and cheery "hello" to his guests.

Critique by Fall Speciality Sweepstakes Judge Mrs. Robert J. Huber, Continued:

There were 52 puppy sweepstakes entries, of which 49 were present. Show chairman, Olive Getzendanner; Margaret Pratt, steward; and Dorothy Chappell, assistant steward, did a marvelous job of facilitating the judging. Many thanks to them.

The puppies were the best I've ever seen in the sweepstakes, and it was a tremendous thrill to see so many of the top quality together. It is certainly encouraging if this is an indication of the future.

Most of the exhibitors and handlers are to be commended for the excellent job done on presenting their entries in lovely coat and condition. It was also very evident that most of the puppies had been carefully trained for the ring. Most all of the youngsters gaited nicely on both tight and loose leads, making it easier to make a true evaluation of their movement. One and all stood beautifully for examination, and there was not one pup that evidenced a sharp temperament or other undesirable traits of behavior. So many were "personality kids" that showed with style and finish.

In general, heads were outstanding, eyes dark, and bites good. Many had adequate bone and compact bodies with good spring of rib. Movement was considerably better than usual with width and drive in rear and reach in front.

Stud Dog Stake, Dogs, 6 to 9 months (3)-A quality class with all three excelling in head.

(1) **Lougin's Delegate**(Dunson). A sound moving dog of compact body and lovely overall balance.
(2) **Mankit's Roust-A-Bout** (K. Miller). A bit longer in back than No. 1. Sound in movement and of good bone and substance. (3) **Mankit's Signal Go** (E. Miller). A beautifully balanced boy. Very showy. Not as good in front as No. 1 and No. 2.

Stud Dog Stake, Dogs 9 to 12 months (6)- The first two were exceptional in balance, bone, and soundness. Both could be finer in head with cleaner skulls. (1) **Jonaire Pocono Top Scholar** (Jonaire K.). A showman with the truest movement, of the class, on tight or loose lead. A shade better in head than No. 2. (2) **Geelong Royal Playboy** (Higgins). We might call him "The Topline" because of his lovely flow of neck into a short, short body to correctly set on tail. Hindquarters outstanding. (3) **Top Notch Eclipse**(Hardie). A dog of lovely head and expression, but lacking the compactness and spring of rib of No. 1 and No. 2. (4) **Phil-Mar Orbit** (Anspach). He possessed the best head of the class. Lovely topline. However he was shallow in chest, lacking spring of rib and was not moving well in the rear.

Stud Dog Stake, Bitches, 6 to 9 months (9) - Another high quality class with the first three being exceptionally good. (1) **Winsome So Tidy** (R. S. Shaw). This little gal just couldn't be denied her placement. Besides being a showman and "asking for it" every minute, she was beautifully made. A smaller bitch than some in the class, but in excellent balance. This balance was best viewed when out of the grass and on the table. A lovely head with tiny, dark, dark eyes gave her a terrific expression. Movement was perfection. A tight, tight front and well-angulated rear. Truly a sparkler. (2) **Lowe's Heloise** (Lowe). Another showy one of quality. Same type as No. 1, but not quite as true in front when moving on a loose lead. (3) **Geelong Missy Girl** (Geelong K.). More ideal in size than No. 1 and No. 2, Excellent topline. Front was not as good as No. 1 and No. 2. (4) **Mankit's Rave-A-Bout** (K. Miller). A bitch with a lovely head and neck, but weak in front.

Critique by Fall Speciality Sweepstakes Judge Mrs. Robert J. Huber, Continued:

Stud Dog Stake, Bitches, 9 to 12 months (10). (1) **Rydalbrook's Perfect Game** (Kaeppler). This bitch won her first placement on her sound movement, beautiful front and substance, even though a cleaner skull and higher tail set would be desired. (2) **Crown-Post Susan** (Crown-Post K.). A bitch with beautiful head and expression. Lovely front. Good mold of body with a place for the elbows. Rear movement could be better. (3) **Rik-Rak Rock Candy** (Ackerman). A beautifully balanced specimen and always showing to her best advantage. Excellent rear movement but lacking in front while standing and moving. (4) **Handful's Seula** (Simmonds). A bitch with much sparkle and breed character. Rear movement was superb. Neck could have been a bit longer to bring her into perfect balance. She did not stand or move well in front.

Brood Bitch Stake, Dogs, 6 to 9 months (3). (Same placements as Stud Dog Stake).

Brood Bitch Stake, Dogs, 9 to 12 months (2). (1) **Top Notch Eclipse** (Hardie). (2) **Andrel's Importance** (Czapski). A dog of substance but not moving well front or rear..

Brood Bitch Stake, Bitches, 6 to 9 months (7). (1) **Winsome So Tidy**. (2) **Lowe's Heloise**. (3) **Mankit's Rave-A-Bout**. (4) **Lowe's Honey** (Lowe). Much the same type as her sister (No. 2), but not showing. In profile she presents a balanced picture. Movement was not as good as it could have been, but she should do better when she gains confidence and experience.

I found this judging assignment a very worthwhile and challenging experience.

American Miniature Schnauzer Club

General Appearance - The Miniature Schnauzer is a robust, active dog of terrier type, resembling his larger cousin, the Standard Schnauzer, in general appearance, and of an alert, active disposition. He is sturdily built, nearly square in proportion of body length to height, with plenty of bone, and without any suggestion of toyishness.

Faults: Type - Toyishness, raciness, or coarseness.

Temperament - The typical Miniature Schnauzer is alert and spirited, yet obedient to command. He is friendly, intelligent and willing to please. He should never be over-aggressive or timid.

Faults - Temperament - Shyness or viciousness.

Head - Strong and rectangular, its width diminishing slightly from ears to eyes, and again to the tip of the nose. The forehead is unwrinkled. The top skull is flat and fairly long. The foreface is parallel to the top skull, with a slight stop; it ends in a moderately blunt manner, with thick whiskers which accentuate the rectangular shape of the head.

Faults: Head coarse and cheeky.

Teeth - The teeth meet in a scissors bite. That is, the upper front teeth overlap the lower front teeth in such a manner that the inner surface of the upper incisors barely touches the outer surface of the lower incisors when the mouth is closed.

Faults: Bite - Undershot or overshot jaw. Level bite.

Eyes - Small, dark brown and deep set. They are oval in appearance and keen in expression.

Faults: Eyes - Light and/or large and prominent in appearance.

Ears - When cropped, the ears are identical in shape and length, with pointed tips. They are in balance with the head and not exaggerated in length. They are set high on the skull and carried perpendicularly at the inner edges, with as little bell as possible along the outer edges. When uncropped, the ears are small and v-shaped, folding close to the skull.

Neck - Strong and well arched, blending into the shoulders, and with the skin fitting tightly at the throat.

Body - Short and deep, with the brisket extending at least to the elbows. Ribs are well sprung and deep, extending well back to the short loin. The underbody does not present a tucked-up appearance at the flank. The topline is straight; it declines slightly from the withers to the base of the tail. The overall length from the chest to the stern bone appears to equal the height at the withers.

Faults: Chest too broad or shallow in brisket. Sway or roach back.

Forequarters - The forequarters have flat, somewhat sloping shoulders and high withers. Forelegs are straight and parallel when viewed from all sides. They have strong pasterns and good bone. They are separated by a fairly deep brisket which precludes a pinched front. The elbows are close, and the ribs spread gradually from the first rib so as to allow space for the elbows to move close to the body.

Faults: Loose elbows.

1979 Continued:

MINIATURE SCHNAUZER *Official Standard* (CONTINUED)

Hindquarters - The hindquarters have strong muscled, slanting thighs; they are well bent at the stifles and straight from hock to so-called heel. There is sufficient angulation so that, in stance, the hocks extend beyond the tail. The hindquarters never appear overbuilt or higher than the shoulders.

Faults: Bowed or cowhocked hindquarters

Feet - Short and round (cat-feet) with thick, black pads. The toes are arched and compact.

Movement - The trot is the gait at which movement is judged. When approaching, the forelegs, with elbows close to the body, move straight forward, neither too close or too far apart. Going away, the hind legs are straight and travel in the same planes as the forelegs.

Note: It is generally accepted that when a full trot is achieved, the rear legs continue to move in the same planes as the forelegs, but a very slight inward inclination will occur. It begins at the point of the shoulder in front and at the hip joint in the rear. Viewed from the front or rear, the legs are straight from these points to the pads. The degree of inward inclination is almost imperceptible in a Miniature Schnauzer that has correct movement. It does not justify moving close, toeing in, crossing, or moving out at the elbows.

Viewed from the side, the forelegs have good reach, while the hind legs have strong drive, with good pickup of hocks. The feet turn neither inward nor outward.

Fault: Single tracking. Sidegaiting. Paddling in front, or high hackney knee action. Weak rear action.

Tail - Set high and carried erect. It is docked only long enough to be clearly visible over the topline of the body when the dog is in proper length of coat.

Faults: Tail set low.

Coat - Double, with hard, wiry, outer coat and close undercoat. Head, neck and body coat must be plucked. When in show condition the body coat should be of sufficient length to determine texture. Close covering on neck, ears and skull. Furnishings are fairly thick but not silky.

Faults: Coat - too soft or too smooth and slick in appearance.

Size - From 12 to 14 inches. Ideal size 13½ inches. (See disqualifications).

Color - The recognized colors are salt and pepper, black and silver, and solid black. The typical color is salt and pepper in shades of gray; tan shading is permissible. The salt and pepper mixture fades out to light gray or silver white in the eyebrows, whiskers, cheeks, under throat, across chest, under tail, leg furnishings, under body, and inside legs. The light under-body hair is not to rise higher on the sides of the body than the front elbows.

The black and silvers follow the same pattern as the salt and peppers. The entire salt and pepper section must be black.

Black is the only solid color allowed. It must be a true black with no gray hairs and no brown tinge except where the whiskers may have become discolored. A small white spot on the chest is permitted. (See disqualifications).

Disqualifications

Dogs or bitches under 12 inches or over 14 inches.

Color solid white or white patches on the body.

MINIATURE SCHNAUZER OFFICIAL STANDARD

Approved January 15, 1991 - Effective February 27, 1991

GENERAL APPEARANCE - The Miniature Schnauzer is a robust, active dog of terrier type, resembling his larger cousin, the Standard Schnauzer, in general appearance, and of an alert, active disposition.

Faults: Type - Toyishness, ranginess or coarseness.

SIZE, PROPORTION, SUBSTANCE. Size - From 12 to 14 inches. He is sturdily built, nearly square in **proportion** of body length to height, with plenty of bone, and without any suggestion of toyishness. **Disqualifications** - Dogs or bitches under 12 inches or over 14 inches.

HEAD. Eyes - Small, dark brown and deep set. They are oval in appearance and keen in **expression**. **Faults:** Eyes light and/or large and prominent in appearance. **Ears** - When cropped, the ears are identical in shape and length, with pointed tips. They are in balance with the head and not exaggerated in length. They are set high on the skull and carried perpendicularly at the inner edges, with as little bell as possible along the outer edges. When uncropped, the ears are small and V-shaped, folding close to the skull. **Head** - Strong and rectangular, its width diminishing slightly from ears to eyes, and again to the tip of the nose. The forehead is unwrinkled. The **topskull** is flat and fairly long. The foreface is parallel to the topskull, with a slight stop, and it is at least as long as the topskull; it ends in a moderately blunt manner, with thick whiskers which accentuate the rectangular shape of the head. **Faults:** - Head coarse and cheeky. The **teeth** meet in **scissors bite**. That is, the upper front teeth overlap the lower front teeth in such a manner that the inner surface of the upper incisors barely touch the outer surface of the lower incisors when the mouth is closed. **Faults:** - Bite - Undershot or overshot jaw. Level bite.

NECK, TOPLINE, BODY. Neck - Strong and well arched, blending into the shoulders, and with the skin fitting tightly at the throat. **Body** - Short and deep, with the brisket extending at least to the elbows. Ribs are well sprung and deep, extending well back to the short loin. The underbody does not present a tucked up appearance at the flank. The **backline** is straight; it declines slightly from the withers to the base of the tail. The withers form the highest part of the body. The overall length from chest to buttock appears to equal the height at the withers. **Faults:** Chest too broad or shallow in brisket. Hollow or roach back. **Tail** - Set high and carried erect. It is docked only long enough to be clearly visible over the topline of the body when the dog is in proper length of coat. **Faults:** - Tail set too low.

1991 Continued:

MINIATURE SCHNAUZER OFFICIAL STANDARD (CONTINUED)

FOREQUARTERS - Forelegs are straight and parallel when viewed from all sides. They have strong pasterns and good bone. They are separated by a fairly deep brisket which precludes a pinched front. The elbows are close, and the ribs spread gradually from the first rib so as to allow space for the elbows to move close to the body. **Faults:** -Loose elbows. The sloping **shoulders** are muscled, yet flat and clean. They are well laid back, so that from the side the tips of the shoulder blades are in a nearly vertical line above the elbow. The tips of the blades are placed closely together. They slope forward and downward at an angulation which permits the maximum extension of the forelegs without binding or effort. Both the shoulder blades and upper arms are long, permitting depth of chest at the brisket. **Feet** - Short and round (cat-feet) with thick, black pads. The toes are arched and compact.

HINDQUARTERS - The hindquarters have strong-muscled, slanting thighs. There is sufficient angulation so that, in stance, the hocks extend beyond the tail. The hindquarters never appear overbuilt or higher than the shoulders. The rear pasterns are short and, in stance, perpendicular to the ground and, when viewed from the rear, are parallel to each other. **Faults:** -Sickle hocks, cow hocks, open hocks or bowed hindquarters.

COAT - Double, with hard, wiry, outer coat and close undercoat. The head, neck, ears, chest, tail, and body coat must be plucked. When in show condition, the body coat should be of sufficient length to determine texture. Close covering on neck, ears and skull. Furnishings are fairly thick but not silky. **Faults:** -Coat too soft or too smooth and slick in appearance.

COLOR - The recognized colors are salt and pepper, black and silver, and solid black. All colors have uniform skin pigmentation, i.e. no white or pink skin patches shall appear anywhere on the dog. **Salt and Pepper** - The typical salt and pepper color of the topcoat results from the combination of black and white banded hairs and solid black and white unbanded hairs, with the banded hairs predominating. Acceptable are all shades of salt and pepper, from light to dark mixtures with tan shadings permissible in the banded or unbanded hair of the top. In salt and pepper dogs, the salt and pepper mixture fades out to light gray or silver white in the eyebrows, whiskers, cheeks, under throat, inside ears, across chest, under tail, leg furnishings, and inside hind legs. It may or may not fade out on the underbody. However, if so, the lighter underbody hair is not to rise higher on the sides of the body than the front elbows. **Black and Silver** - The black and silver generally follows the same pattern as the salt and pepper. The entire salt and pepper section must be black. The black color in the topcoat of the black and silver is a true rich color with black undercoat. The stripped portion is free from any fading or brown tinge and the underbody should be dark. **Black** - Black is the only solid color allowed. Ideally, the black color in the topcoat is a true rich glossy solid color with the undercoat being less intense, a soft matting shade of black. This is natural and should not be penalized in any way. The stripped portion is free from any fading or brown tinge. The scissored and clipped areas have lighter shades of black. A small white spot on the chest is permitted, as is an occasional single white hair elsewhere on the body. **Disqualifications:** - Color solid white or white striping, patching, or spotting on the colored areas of the dog, except for the small white spot permitted on the chest of the black.

The body coat color in salt and pepper and black and silver dogs fades out to light gray or silver white under the throat and across the chest. Between them there exists a natural body coat color. Any irregular or connecting blaze or white mark in this section is considered a white patch on the body, which is also a disqualification.

GAIT - The trot is the gait at which movement is judged. When approaching, the forelegs, with elbows close to the body, move straight forward, neither too close or too far apart. Going away, the hind legs are straight and travel in the same planes as the forelegs.

1991 Continued:

MINIATURE SCHNAUZER OFFICIAL STANDARD (CONTINUED)

Note: It is generally accepted that when a full trot is achieved, the rear legs continue to move in the same planes as the forelegs, but a very slight inward inclination will occur. It begins at the point of the shoulder in front and at the hip joint in the rear. Viewed from the front or rear, the legs are straight from these points to the pads. The degree of inward inclination is almost imperceptible in a Miniature Schnauzer that has correct movement. It does not justify moving close, toeing in, crossing, or moving out at the elbows.

Viewed from the side, the forelegs have good reach, while the hind legs have strong drive, with good pickup of hocks. The feet turn neither inward nor outward.

Faults: - Single tracking, sidegaiting, paddling in front, or hackney action. Weak rear action.

Temperament - The typical Miniature Schnauzer is alert and spirited, yet obedient to command. He is friendly, intelligent and willing to please. He should never be over-aggressive or timid.

Disqualifications - Dogs or bitches under 12 inches or over 14 inches.

Color solid white or white striping, patching, or spotting on the colored areas of the dog, except for the small white spot permitted on the chest of the black.

The body coat color in salt and pepper and black and silver dogs fades out to light gray or silver white under the throat and across the chest. Between them there exists a natural body coat color. Any irregular or connecting blaze or white mark in this section is considered a white patch on the body, which is also a disqualification.

PRA PROJECT - The AMSC Board of Governors voted at the fall board meeting during Montgomery County weekend to begin a major fund raising campaign to help fund a research project on DNA testing at Cornell University. The proposal, which was approved by the Board reads as follows:

1. That the AMSC begin raising funds for the PRA research program proposed by the Baker Institute of Cornell University.
2. That the Board be authorized to enter into a commitment with Cornell University on behalf of the AMSC if the first year's funding of \$55,000 is raised within six months. If the first year's funding of \$55,000 is not raised within six months, the Board will consider the project again at the April 1995 Board meeting.
3. That articles on eye diseases, including, but not limited to PRA, may be published in AMSCOPE and other appropriate outlets upon approval of the President and the Chairman of the Eye Committees.

PRA PROJECT Update:

On February 18, 1995, the American Kennel Club advised the AMSC that it had approved supporting the AMSC PRA Project. The AKC said that "The decision to provide support was made because of the worth of the project as presented and because it is believed the project offers potential to be of significant benefit to many breeds." The AKC has agreed to match the funds which the AMSC raises up to \$87,500 (which is half the budgeted cost of the proposed 3-year research project).

At the April Board meeting the Board agreed to commit to the Project in recognition of the broad support the PRA Project has received and the fact that in just five months almost enough funds have been raised for two of the three years of the budgeted research.

UPDATE: As of August 1995, the AMSC had raised \$73,500 which, with the matching AKC funds, leaves only \$14,000 more required to be raised for the three year project.

At the June meeting the AMSC Board of Governors voted to hold Veteran Sweepstakes classes at all future AMSC Specialities. It had been decided earlier to hold this new class on a trial basis in conjunction with the Western Terrier Association Show at which the 145th (Summer) AMSC Speciality was held.

NOTE OF INTEREST:

A draft copy of the AMSC HISTORY was released in late November 1995 for preliminary evaluation by the BOARD OF GOVERNORS and major contributors. Results from this evaluation will be incorporated and a final release made in the spring of 1996.
