Healthgene Testing Available

Healthgene is a company that offers a variety of DNA testing for several dog breeds as well as other species. Recently the AMSC Board approved registering the club with Healthgene to enable AMSC members to receive discount pricing on testing.

Healthgene currently offers two DNA tests for our breed: Myotonia congenita and DNA Parentage.

The method for Myotonia testing is the same as that used elsewhere, however the DNA Parentage is not the same as that used by the AKC. Members wishing to use the DNA Parentage testing should thoroughly investigate this option beforehand.

Healthgene does not currently offer any other DNA tests specific to our breed. Members of the AMSC are eligible for a 5% discount on testing. Make sure you mark your affiliation on the submission form.

The AMSC Board and Health Committee are making this information available to the membership. The AMSC does not make any recommendations as to testing agencies. This announcement is intended simply to inform the membership of the availability of this service.

Healthgene and Mycobacterium avium Testing

Healthgene has the ability to detect the M. avium pathogen in the blood of dogs. This test identifies the pathogen through it's own DNA, and does not have anything to do with testing the DNA of the dog.

This test has the potential to become a useful tool in early diagnosis of this disease in our breed. However, it is not clear if this test is a specific reliable indicator of systemic disease in a dog.

Several months ago Healthgene detected the pathogen in the blood of an ill Miniature Schnauzer. This finding raised a number of questions. One breeder decided to submit random samples from her dogs. This breeder has dogs with risk for susceptibility to infection based on pedigree analysis, as well as unrelated dogs with no risk based on pedigree analysis.

She submitted 6 samples for testing, and all 6 results were positive for the M. avium pathogen in the blood. None of these dogs were sick. One of the dogs tested is the product of a test-breeding of two producing animals, and one of these dogs was not related, and has no known risk.

This breeder felt the random testing could provide some insight into the diagnostic value of the test, and she felt her colony of dogs was well suited because of potential exposure due to the high bird population in her area. To date, all 6 dogs are apparently healthy.

Our committee researched and could not locate any published veterinary literature on this test or it's development.

We want the membership to be aware that while this test may offer more rapid diagnosis of disease in a symptomatic dog, it is unclear whether results of this test definitively indicate a dog is or is not genetically susceptible to infection. As evidenced by the random testing mentioned above, a dog testing positive may not develop systemic disease, but may have been exposed to the pathogen. It is further advised not to presume that a negative result indicates a dog is not genetically susceptible to infection, as the dog may not have been exposed to the pathogen.

In our investigation of this test, we talked with two researchers who were unable to state as fact that it was abnormal to isolate this pathogen from the blood of an immune-competent dog. Since this defect has been considered a macrophage defect, it is possible that environmental exposure could result in pathogen in the blood. In a "normal" dog, the host immune system should then contain and eliminate the pathogen.

Our committee is not discounting this test, but advises results should be interpreted with caution. There is no question this test can indicate exposure to M. avium, however, there is no documentation to support the concept that the results of this test are an indicator of either a dog's genetic susceptibility to disease or future systemic illness.

**APRIL AKC CHAIRMAN'S
REPORT**

New York, NY – Rally is AKC's newest dog sport and it is sweeping the nation. It was created to promote a positive relationship between the dog and its owner. Rally is also the ultimate spectator sport. It is easy for spectators to understand and enjoy watching, even if they have never been to a dog show. Every station a dog and handler must pass by has a sign providing instructions regarding the skill that is to be performed.

Rally was designed with the average pet dog owner in mind, as a way to introduce them into the world of dog sports and provides a link from the Canine Good Citizen® (CGC) program to obedience or agility competition, both for dogs and handlers. It also provides AKC with a new avenue to highlight the importance and benefits of training your dog.

Emphasis is on fun and excitement for the dog and handler by providing a more "natural" approach to the performance. Rally is made up of a series of colored signs laid out in a specific format designed by the judge. Each dog and handler is judged on the execution of a single, continuous performance of numbered exercises on a course, uninterrupted by orders from the judge. Perfect heel position is not required but handlers must maintain a loose leash at all times.

Animation and enthusiasm throughout the performance is encouraged. Unlimited communication from the handler to the dog is permitted. Handlers are allowed to talk, praise, encourage, clap their hands, pat their legs, or use any verbal means of encouragement, and multiple commands and/or signals using one or both arms and hands.

The initial level of involvement is very promising. The AKC already has 658 approved rally trials in 2005. Through the end of February there have been 8,912 dogs entered in this new sport. There are 58 approved trials for the month of March, 94 in April and an amazing 116 in May!

These figures are truly outstanding, particularly when comparing the first year of agility where we had 23 trials and 2,000 entries. Rally is truly a sport for anyone.

It is a positive and rewarding new event for dogs and their owners and we look forward to seeing it grow.

DAY OF SHOW PARKING - CSULB parking staff will sell tickets each day - \$3.00 per day. These tickets must be placed on the dash of each vehicle parked in the lot. Handicapped parking is available adjacent to the show grounds at the same charge.

NOTE: NO GROOMING ALLOWED IN DAY-OF-SHOW PARKING AREA.

PLEASE REFER TO YOUR JUDGING PROGRAM FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION. No vehicles will be allowed on the George Allen Field. Unloading will be allowed only in the area designated for such.

RESERVED OVERNIGHT PARKING - There are a limited number of spaces available for overnight parking. As you are aware, the increased cost of venue/facility rental, fuel, electrical in the State of California and the like have forced our clubs to increase the cost of electrical for our shows to cover the expenses. No profit is generated whatsoever from any overnight parking. All vehicles must be entirely self-contained. Spaces are available by advanced reservations or at the gate the day before the specialties. Advanced reservations are available at the prices listed below:

Overnight Parking Fees:

- \$30.00 per night – Up to 40 Feet.
- \$50.00 per night – Over 40 Feet (Vehicles over 40' in length will be accommodated only where possible.)

R.V. power hook ups in the Overnight Parking Area are available at the following cost:

- 1 Hook up 30 AMP - \$35.00 per night - *2-night minimum, 3rd & 4th night at ½ price.
- 2 Hook ups or 50 AMP - \$55.00 per night - *2-night minimum, 3rd & 4th night at ½ price.

Reservations must be received by June 8, 2005. The gate closes at 10:00 p.m. If you wish to park next to someone specific, please send your reservations together, or arrive together. Overnight parking is available from Wednesday, June 22, 2005 at 2 PM.

RULES -The overnight parking area is a privilege extended by GWTA/LBKC/KCBH. The clubs reserve the right to withdraw this privilege from any person who feels that he or she cannot abide by the rules and instructions given or resorts to abusive language and/or other tactics. Any infractions will be referred to the Bench Committee for appropriate action. Trailers and tow units may be required to be unhitched. All vehicles and pens must be confined to a 20 x 35 foot area. You may purchase additional area if necessary. All vehicles must be self-contained. There will be no water hook-ups. Exhibitors are responsible for clean up of their parking spaces.

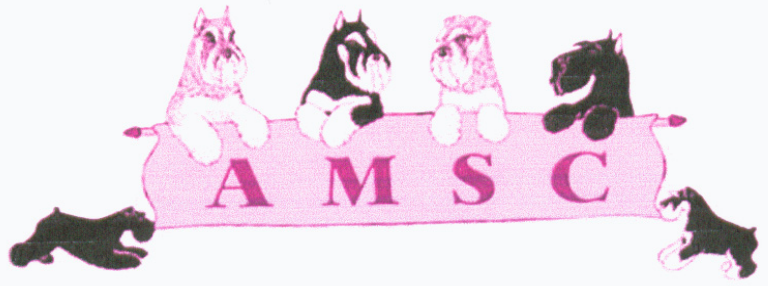

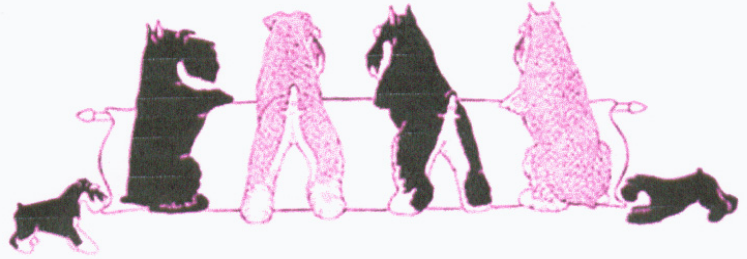

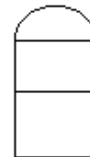
